#### **ACT Information**

The next ACT dates are as follows:

April 6 -- Registration due March 4 -- Late Registration due March 18

June 11 -- Registration due May 6 -- Late Registration due May 20

Students can pick up an ACT preparation booklet from Ms. Hermsmeier's office. This booklet includes practice test questions as well as ACT testing strategies.

#### Senior Information

#### It's FAFSA Time!

If you are a college-bound senior, you must complete FAFSA (Free Application for Federal State Aid) to apply for state, federal, and college-based financial aid. Submit the form before your college's FAFSA priority date (typically between March 1 and April 1) as some financial aid is awarded first-come, first served. Check with your college(s) to learn their priority date. This is a FREE service at FAFSA.gov (if you are asked to pay, you are at the incorrect site).

Follow these steps to complete the FAFSA:

- Create a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) for you and one for a parent at fsaid.ed.gov. You'll use the ID to access the FAFSA and other Federal Student Aid websites, and as your electronic signature for the FAFSA.
- Complete your taxes early as the FAFSA requires current tax information. Within three weeks after you and your parents file your tax forms, your IRS data should be available to retrieve and transfer into your FAFSA through the IRS Data Retrieval process (available as of February 7, 2016).
- Gather these student and parent items:
  - 2015 federal income tax forms and, if applicable, Schedule K-1 (Form 1065)
  - 2015 W-2 forms
  - Student driver's license number
  - Social Security numbers
  - · Birth dates
  - · Date parents were married, separated, divorced, or widowed
  - Current cash, savings, and checking account balances
  - Current investment values (stocks, bonds, mutual funds, CDs, etc.) excluding your home and retirement accounts
  - · Value of business (if more than 100 employees)
  - Value of investment farm (Do not include the value of a family farm that you or your parents live on and operate.)
  - 2015 child support (paid and/or received)
  - 2015 Workers' Compensation
  - · Other untaxed income in 2015 such as housing/food/living allowances for military and clergy
  - Alien Registration Number for eligible non-citizens
  - Be prepared to indicate on the FAFSA if during 2015, you or anyone in your household received Supplemental Security Income, SNAP, TANF, Free or Reduced Lunch, and/or WIC.

• Complete the FAFSA at FAFSA.gov . The colleges you list on the application should receive the results within 48 hours.

#### Other Scholarship Information

Seniors have received a sheet that has a list of scholarships that I have received during the course of this school year. The scholarship list is also available on the bulletin board outside of the main office. As scholarships become available, I will continue to update this list and send it out to seniors. In addition, you can check out the scholarship page on my website. You may access this through the Lewiston Consolidated webpage by clicking on the staff link at the top of the page and clicking my name (Lisa Hermsmeier) under certified staff. Seniors can also apply for scholarships through EducationQuest at <u>www.scholarshipquest.org</u>. I am here to assist with any questions or assistance with the scholarship application process. Please do not hesitate to ask any questions that you or your student may have.

## Lewiston FFA Completes Service Project

The Lewiston FFA Chapter cooperated with the Wymore Good Samaritan Center on a service project recently. The members constructed a gardening bed for the residents.

The FFA wrote a grant to the Thrivent for Lutherans community outreach program. The funds were used to purchase treated lumber to construct a  $3' \times 10'$  garden planter. The 32'' high bed will allow individuals in wheel chairs to plant spring vegetables and flowers.
