8th Grade College Visit

On April 6, 2016, 8th grade students took a trip to see the campuses at both Peru State College and Southeast Community College. This was part of an 8th grade EducationQuest grant to allow students the opportunity to see a campus and start thinking about college before their high school classes start this Fall.

At Peru State College, students began with a tour of the campus, including seeing the new Peru State College Oakbowl (Peru's football stadium). Students were then able to listen to speakers talk about the basics of college. Speakers discussed early entry classes, different majors, athletics, dorm life, and scholarships. However, most importantly, students learned about how important their high school grades and involvement are, and that their freshman year is just as important as their senior year.

At Southeast Community College, students were able to learn about the main major areas the college has to offer. The tour started with nursing and being able to listen to the nurse department's training mannequin and check her heartbeat and pulse. Continuing on, students were able to learn about the computer education department. In the Criminal justice department, students learned how to pick up a finger print that was in the dirt as well as seeing materials that are often used in the criminal justice field. The day ended in the ag department and seeing the Southeast Community College greenhouse.

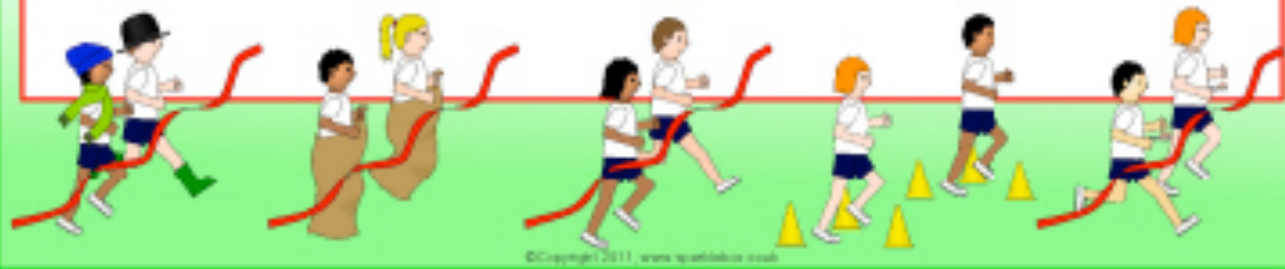

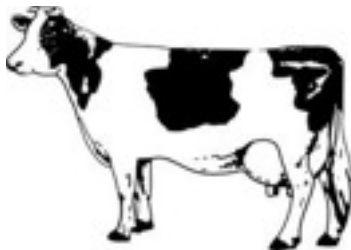

Lewiston FFA Receives Award from the Nutrients for Life Foundation's Helping Communities Grow Program

Washington, D.C. – The Nutrients for Life Foundation announced Lewiston FFA chapter was the first place winner of a \$3,000.00 award in the Helping Communities Grow FFA chapter recognition program in Nebraska. The Foundation awarded the Lewiston FFA Chapter for creating a pre-show promotional screen shot that was played at a local movie theater for several months. Movie goers viewed the shot that showcased healthy soils and the importance of fertilizers in feeding a growing population. They also hosted a member/guest Agribusiness Tour with visits to area businesses that have expertise in fertilizer and soils. In addition, the chapter conducted educational presentations with the fifth grade elementary students and produced promotional videos for the Nutrients For Life Foundation to post on their social media sites.

“I am so impressed with the quality of projects we received in our Helping Communities Grow FFA chapter competition,” said Nutrients for Life Foundation Executive Director Harriet Wegmeyer. “It gives us great honor to award these checks to such deserving students. Not only did they educate fellow students and their communities about the important value of fertilizer, they expanded their leadership ability, communication skills and knowledge base during the year-long projects.”

The Helping Communities Grow program recognizes FFA chapters’ efforts in informing the public about essential plant nutrients role in feeding the world. During the project, students gained skills in leadership, public speaking, team building and community awareness while increasing knowledge of soil science and agricultural issues. FFA chapters who entered qualifying projects, but did not win one of the top three awards, each received \$250 for their participation.

The Nutrients for Life Foundation spearheads the mission to educate students and the public about responsible fertilizer use in our growing world. Since its formation over ten years ago, the Foundation has reached over 23.8 million students with resources such as “Nourishing the Planet in the 21st Century,” the Smithsonian approved, STEM curriculum. Nutrients for Life’s Helping Communities Grow program is a recognition program for FFA chapters that brings fertilizer education to the chapter’s local communities. The Nutrients for Life Foundation is a tax-exempt status organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Lewiston Attends 88th State FFA Convention

Lewiston Agriculture Education students were well represented at the 88th State FFA Convention held in Lincoln April 7th-9th. The convention headquarters were at the Pinnacle Bank Arena and surrounding downtown hotels. This year's theme was, "Amplify: Boost Your Impact!"

The Lewiston FFA Chapter had a good state showing. The Chapter received a silver National Chapter rating placing them in the top twenty-two Nebraska chapters. The membership earned a gold rating and a plaque in Natural Resources, a silver rating in Chapter Safety activities and a bronze rating in Community Service activities. The Lewiston Chapter also received a certificate in the "Feed Nebraska" program. Ryan Husa and Miah Fulton went on stage to receive one of 19 Chapter "Governor's Excellence Award" banners from Nebraska Governor Pete Ricketts.

The Chapter was awarded first place in the state "Helping Communities Grow" competition sponsored by the Nutrients for Life Foundation. The local group received \$3,000.00 for their efforts.

In the Leadership Skills Events, the Agriculture Demonstration team placed seventh and earned a gold plaque for their "Small Engine Maintenance" demonstration. Junior High Ag Literacy Speaker Dana Christen was presented a gold medal for her speech on prescribed burning. Senior Jacob Meybrunn earned a bronze medal in the Job Interview Contest.

Ryan Husa and Dalton Anderson had the State FFA Degree bestowed on them in ceremonies Friday. Their parents were in attendance for the ceremonies. Miah Fulton, Ryan Husa, and Megan Wehrbein and Cari Howell served the Chapter as convention delegates. Megan and Miah attended a legislative breakfast on Thursday at the Holiday Inn. They met with Unicameral State Senator Dan Watermeier.

Chapter President Dalton Anderson was nominated and recognized as one of twenty-four Nebraska FFA State Star candidates. Dalton interviewed for the recognition. His parents and FFA Advisor accompanied him on stage to receive his plaque. He was the third Lewiston FFA member in Chapter history to earn this honor.

Competing in the 2016 State Ag Science Fair were Megan Wehrbein & Cari Howell, Treyton Hippen & Logan Anderson, Kristin Meybrunn and Levi Meybrunn & Ryan Hunt. A special thanks goes out to Lewiston School's science teacher Devin Garcia for his help on projects.

Seventh grade students Masyn Arena and Taylor Anderson entered the Middle School "People in Agriculture" competition. This activity was an agriculture career poster and interview project.

The Nebraska FFA Foundation recognized Lewiston Consolidated Schools Supt., Mr. Rick Kentfield, on stage. Supt. Kentfield was given the "Cornerstone Award" for his support and vision in promoting agriculture education.

Dalton Anderson was awarded the second place plaque and a cash award for his finish in the State Dairy Placement Proficiency on Friday. Dalton and his parents attended a recognition banquet on Thursday.

Other convention highlights were attending a state career show, a Thursday presentation by the Kansas Peterson Brothers video sensation on being agriculture advocates and convention sessions. Thursday evening the members attended the state "Rock the Rec" event at UN-L's Cook Pavilion.
