Nebraska District 1 Unicameral Sen. Dan Watermeier joined FFA delegates for the Legislative Breakfast last Thursday in Lincoln. Lewiston FFA members Caleb Bredemeier and Skyler Salts represented their chapter along with delegates from Pawnee City, Auburn and HTRS. The event was part of the 89th State FFA Convention held in Lincoln.

LEWISTON FFA AWARDED “GRANTS FOR GROWING” SCHOLARSHIP

In support of the next generation of agricultural leaders, Tractor Supply Company and the National FFA Foundation partnered for the second consecutive year to back student-driven agriculture projects that will benefit their communities and FFA chapters for years to come. This year, Grants for Growing raised a record \$731,000 for these impressive projects.

Tractor Supply Company, the largest rural lifestyle retail store chain in the United States, awarded 316 Grants for Growing to FFA chapters which requested funding for a wide variety of sustainable projects. From greenhouses to aquaculture labs and much more, the grants will be used to purchase supplies such as vegetation, trees, seed, mulch and tools.

Between Jan. 10 and Feb. 13, the National FFA Foundation received over 800 applications from FFA chapters across the country detailing how they will start or expand a unique and sustainable project. During National FFA Week, Feb. 17 through Feb. 26, Tractor Supply hosted a 10-day instore event nationwide that offered shoppers the opportunity to donate \$1 or more at checkout in support of the program.

The Lewiston FFA joined Milford and Wiber-Clatonia as the only Chapters in Nebraska to receive the grants. The local Chapter plans to construct picnic tables to be used at the Lewiston City Park and Pawnee County Fairgrounds. The members also plan to conduct a painting spruce up project.



Lewiston Attends 89th State FFA Convention

Lewiston Agriculture Education students were well represented at the 89th State FFA Convention held in Lincoln April 5th-7th. The convention headquarters were at the Pinnacle Bank Arena and surrounding downtown hotels. This year's theme was, "Transform: Purpose to Action!"

The Lewiston FFA Chapter had a good state showing. The Chapter received a silver National Chapter rating placing them in the top twenty-two Nebraska chapters. The Lewiston Chapter also received a certificate in the "Feed Nebraska" program. Megan Wehrbein and Miah Fulton went on stage to receive one of 19 Chapter "Governor's Excellence Award" banners from Nebraska Lt. Governor Tim Foley.

In the Leadership Skills Events, Junior High Ag Discovery Speaker Taylor Anderson was presented a bronze medal for her speech on the dairy industry. Senior Cari Howell earned a bronze medal in the Cooperative Speaking Contest. Vice President Megan Wehrbein received a silver medal in Natural Resources Speaking.

Cari Howell and Kristin Meybrunn had the State FFA Degree bestowed on them in ceremonies Friday. Caleb Bredemeier and Skyler Salts served the Chapter as convention delegates. These members attended a legislative breakfast on Thursday at the Cornhusker Marriott Hotel. They met with Unicameral State Senator Dan Watermeier.

Competing in the 2017 State Ag Science Fair were Megan Wehrbein & Cari Howell, Ryan Hunt & Logan Anderson, and Dana Christen. Eighth grade FFA members Taylor Anderson and Masyn Arena finished in first place in their agri-science fair division. Their team won a plaque and will be considered for national competition. A special thanks goes out to Lewiston School's science teacher Devin Garcia for his help on projects.

Dalton Anderson was awarded the third place plaque and a cash award for his placing in the State Dairy Placement Proficiency on Friday. The Lewiston FFA cooperated with the Burwell FFA Chapter is setting up a booth in the lobby of Pinnacle Bank Arena to raise funds for the Kansas Wildfire Relief program. The Chapters collected over \$1,000.00 for the stressed beef producers.

Junior High students Jon Janssen, Johnathon Burgett, Taylor Anderson and Masyn Arena competed in the state junior high agriculture quiz bowl on UN-L's East Campus on Friday. Thursday evening the members attended the state "Rock the Rec" event at UN-L's Cook Pavilion.
