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Reading is Important at Lewiston School

All Lewiston students are encouraged to read outside of the classroom. Your student should be reading at home. We are encouraging them to read books that are in their reading level as determined by the Star Reading test. They will take Accelerated Reading tests on the books read.

At the end of the year, we will have a pizza party for those students that earn a certain amount of points. Kindergarten through 3^{rd} grade will need at least 60 points, and $4th_{-}12^{th}$ graders will need to reach at least 80 points.

The 7th_12th graders will also earn incentives each nine weeks for reaching their reading goal. The goals are set by their reading level. The incentives will include movie passes, a school movie night, free pizza, and a year end activity in Lincoln.

The PTO is again providing treats for the "Golden Ticket" program. Numerous golden tickets are hidden in a variety of books in the library. Students that read the book and pass the Accelerated Reading test will receive a treat. This is open to all Lewiston students.

Seniors...it's time to prepare for the early FAFSA!

Beginning **October 1**, you can apply for federal, state and college-based financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (<u>FAFSA</u>). This is a change from previous years when students had to wait until after January 1 to apply.

Here's how you can prepare:

Create a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID for you and one for a parent at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>. You and a parent will each need an FSA ID to access and sign the FAFSA.

Be aware of your college's FAFSA priority date. Complete your FAFSA before that date as some financial aid is awarded first come, first served. Contact your college's financial aid office to learn their priority date.

Attend an EducationQuest Financial Aid Program (FAP) to learn about the FAFSA and the financial aid process. If you attend, *you'll be eligible to register for a <u>\$500 scholarship</u>! FAPs will be held at high schools across the state. <u>Click here</u> for dates and locations.*

Attend a College Fair this fall!

This fall, EducationQuest will sponsor five College Fairs across the state.

Before you attend, visit <u>NebraskaCollegeFairs.org</u> to register for a barcode. Print the barcode and take it to the fair so that college reps can scan it. You should also register for a barcode if you plan to attend an Educational Planning Program (see article below).

Meet with college reps at an Educational Planning Program

If you can't make it to a College Fair, attend <u>an Educational Planning Program (EPP) at an area school</u>. These "mini college fairs" feature state and regional colleges along with college planning information.

If you plan to attend an EPP, visit <u>NebraskaCollegeFairs.org</u> to register for a barcode. Print the barcode and take it to the event so that college reps can scan it.

Senior students and parents...start preparing for college admission!

Admission deadlines will start hitting later this fall. Follow these steps to stay on track:

1. Contact your top colleges and ask about application deadlines for admission, college-based scholarships and financial aid.

2. Visit with college representatives at <u>College Fairs</u>, <u>Educational Planning Programs</u>, during campus visits, and when they visit your high school.

3. Apply to your top 3-4 colleges before the deadline. Along with your application, the colleges will require your high school transcript, class rank, GPA and ACT/SAT score. They may also request a list of your extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, an essay, and an interview.




Lewiston FFA Enters County Parade
