# Simple reading practice



I've found a way to give my children not reading practice — and improve their behavior at the same time. I write short notes to my kids and leave them around the house.

Sometimes I'll mention my youngsters' good behavior ("Thanks for helping with the dishes!") or write reminders ("Please hang me up. Signed, Your towel"). Sometimes the notes are about not-so-good behavior. ("I was disappointed when you yelled at me. Can we talk about it?") I make sure to leave notes for treats, too ("Let's go fly your kite this afternoon!").

> I look for unusual places to put the notes, such as on their pillows, in front of the dog's water bowl, or pinned to the shower curtain. The kids enjoy discovering the notes and reading them aloud.♥

### October 2014

The FACS room is buzzing with activity as we enter the end of the first quarter.

**Teen Living** is learning about the family life cycle and family crisis. They will be moving into relationships, both peer and family relationships.

**Textiles** are moving quickly through basic skills and created pillowcases, a drawstring bag, a zipper pouch, and a sewing machine cover before choosing an individual project.

**Foods 1** class can talk about nutrition, how to be safe in the kitchen, proper table etiquette, and are beginning to prepare simple dishes.

**Quick and Easy Foods** class are becoming skillful cooks. Vegetable dishes, fruit dishes, and eggs dishes have been on the menu. This class prepares simple dishes that can be prepared in 30 minutes or less.
