- **Location** - Is the college too close? If you come home every weekend, you won't experience true campus life. Is the college too far away? If so, you may not make it home as often as you'd like.
- **Cost** - Can your family afford the school? What can you expect for financial aid beyond your freshman year? Did you receive renewable scholarships? How much in student and parent loans will you need to cover expenses?
- **Academic program** - Does the college offer the program that interests you? What happens if you change majors? Does the college offer other programs that interest you?
- **Student life** - Does the school offer activities you will enjoy? Do you like the living arrangements provided by the school? Will you have an opportunity to work on or near campus?
- **Make your final decision by May 1** - and then notify the colleges you're rejecting so they can offer your spot, and any financial aid, to another student.

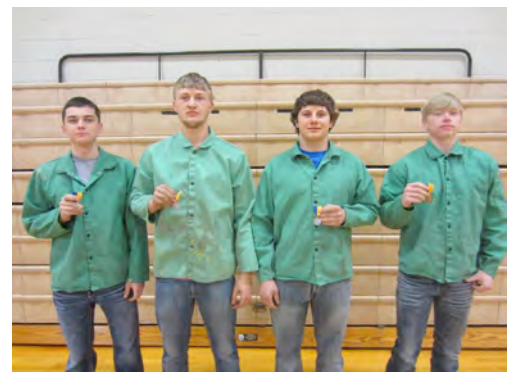

Howell, Meybrunn Earn State FFA Degree

Two Lewiston High School Agriculture Education students have received the 2017 Nebraska State FFA Degree. The seniors are Kristin Meybrunn, daughter of Jon & Christi Meybrunn of Oketo, KS and Cari Howell daughter of Galen & Dana Steinacher and Terry & Paula Howell of Lewiston.

The State FFA Degree is the highest degree the Nebraska State FFA Association can bestow. A member must be a senior or one year out of high school to apply. They must have a "C" academic average, submit two years of financial record books, interview with a board of Ag Education instructors and pass an oral and written test. In addition the applicant must earn 500 leadership points, participate in ten school and/or community activities, serve as an officer or committee chair and volunteer for 25 hours of community service. The student must be versed in parliamentary procedure and public speaking.

State Degree ceremonies will be conducted at the State FFA Convention in Lincoln on April 7th at Pinnacle Bank Arena. Mr. Dave Barnard has served as the candidates Advisor.

Howell serves the Lewiston FFA as President this year. Her Supervised Agriculture Experience (S.A.E.) program consists of placement at Country Natural in Lewiston and at Terry's Steakhouse in Virginia. She is a past Nebraska State FFA Ag Science contestant, State Ag Demonstration team member and State Cooperative Speaking competitor.

Meybrunn is the Chapter Reporter. Her S.A.E. consists of farm placement on Meybrunn Farms. She has competed on the State FFA level in Ag Demonstration and Agri-Science. Kristin also competed on the National FFA level in Dairy Products.


