*Watch your grades. If you slack off and get poor grades, your college admission could be revoked.

*Complete the financial aid process. By now, you should have filed your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). If you haven't, apply at fafsa.gov. Compare financial aid award notifications. The colleges you listed on your FAFSA will send you notifications detailing the financial aid they're offering. Compare the notifications to determine which school provides the best package.

*Apply for scholarships. See ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org to find Nebraska-based scholarships and a list of national scholarship sites Make your final college selection. Notify the other colleges so they can take you off their mailing list.

*Pay attention to deadlines. Be aware of deadlines to accept financial aid and college admission offers, housing deposit, and new-student orientation.

Collin spent the day visiting junior and senior high classes. His topics centered on careers, interviewing, being an advocate, Nebraska Foods and hot topics in agriculture.

Collin and his 2016-17 Nebraska State FFA Officer team will retire at the April 7th FFA Convention in Lincoln. There are seven Nebraska state officers. The statewide visits are funded in part by the Nebraska Corn Board.





Lewiston FFA Competes at District Contests

The Lewiston FFA Chapter qualified two speakers at the District 1 FFA Leadership Skills Events on Jan. 31st. The competition was held at the SCC-Beatrice campus. There are 16 Southeast Nebraska schools in the District. The contests were State Qualifying events for the April 5-7th, 2017 Nebraska FFA Contests in Lincoln. The top two teams or individuals qualify for state. The top three teams or individuals received medals. Thirteen contests held were conducted.

The Ag Demonstration team of Kristin Meybrunn, Logan Anderson, Cari Howell and Megan Wehrbein placed 3rd and were the first alternate to state. They received bronze medals and a team purple ribbon.

In Junior Public Speaking, Logan Anderson placed 3rd with a blue ribbon and earned the bronze medal. He is first alternate to state. Dana Christen received a red ribbon.

Megan Wehrbein brought home the gold medal and qualified for State in Natural Resources Speaking. She received first purple.

Chapter President Cari Howell won the Cooperative Speaking Contest. Cari earned first purple, a gold medal and the right to compete in Lincoln.

Junior High student Masyn Arena earned the top blue ribbon and a bronze medal in AG Literacy Speaking. She is first alternate to State.

Eighth graders Taylor Anderson and Ty Young competed in AG Discovery Speaking. Taylor earned the top blue and a bronze medal. She is the alternate to state. Ty received a red ribbon.

In the Job Interview competition senior Kristin Meybrunn won the top blue in her group. Sophomore Reesa Wilcox was the top blue in her group. Both girls just missed the finals. Twenty students were entered in this contest.

Chapter Secretary Miah Fulton earned a white ribbon in Senior Public Speaking.

The eighth grade team of Masyn Arena, Taylor Anderson, Jon Janssen and Cayd Wilgers competed in the Junior High Ag Quiz Bowl. Their team only lost to eventual champion Pawnee City in a tie-breaker.
