## NeSA (Nebraska State Accountability) Tests to Take Place in April

During the month of April, students in grades 3-8, and 11 will be taking the NeSA tests (reading, math, and science). The classroom teacher should inform each student when they will be taking the tests. Please make sure that your students is well rested and eats a good breakfast on the day of the test. We appreciate your help in ensuring each student is prepared to do their best the day of the test.

### What are the NeSA Tests?

- NeSA tests are state-developed tests in the subjects of reading, mathematics, science, and writing.
- Most NeSA tests are administered online. Fourth grade writing is administered paper/pencil.
- NeSA test results are publicly reported each fall in the State of Schools report.
- NeSA test results are used for both state and federal accountability reports.

### Who takes the NeSA Tests?

- Students in grades 3-8, and 11 take the NeSA reading and mathematics tests.
- Students in grades 5, 8, and 11 take the NeSA science test.
- Students in grades 4, 8, and 11 take the NeSA writing test (completed in January).

### How can parents help their children with NeSA Tests?

- Parents should make certain their children attend school regularly.
- Parents should monitor to be sure students complete homework.
- Parents should communicate regularly with the school.
- Parents can be sure students are rested before the tests.

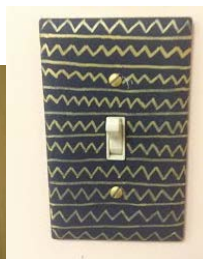
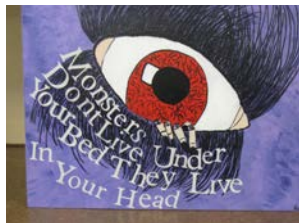
**PBL - Project Based Learning Class**

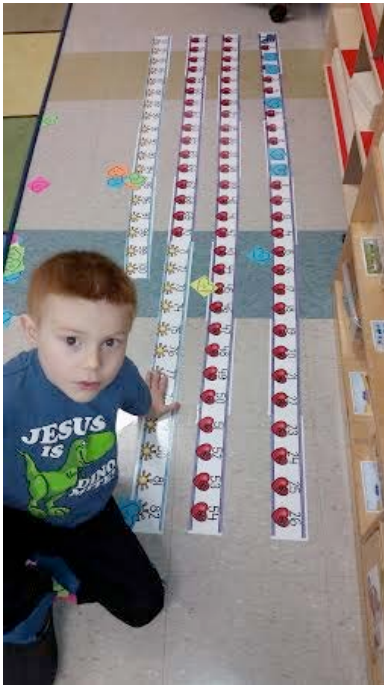

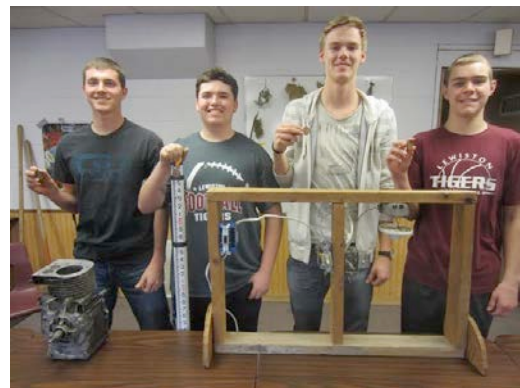

## ANDERSON, HUSA EARN STATE FFA DEGREE

Two Lewiston High School Agriculture Education students have received the Nebraska State FFA Degree. The seniors are Dalton Anderson, son of Spencer & Jeanine Anderson of Virginia, and Ryan Husa, son of Larry & Deb Husa of Liberty.

The State FFA Degree is the highest degree the Nebraska State FFA Association can bestow. A member must be a senior or one year out of high school to apply. They must have a "C" academic average, submit two years of financial record books, interview with a board of Ag Education instructors and pass an oral and written test. In addition the applicant must earn 500 leadership points, participate in ten school and/or community activities, serve as an officer or committee chair and volunteer for 25 hours of community service. The student must be versed in parliamentary procedure and public speaking.

State Degree ceremonies will be conducted at the State FFA Convention in Lincoln on April 8<sup>th</sup> at Pinnacle Bank Arena. Mr. John Robison and Mr. Dave Barnard have served as the candidates Advisors.

Anderson serves the Lewiston FFA as President this year. His Supervised Agriculture Experience (S.A.E.) program consists of Dairy Placement. He is a past Nebraska State FFA Ag Science contestant, State Ag Demonstration team member and State Cooperative Speaking competitor.

Husa is the Chapter Treasurer. His S.A.E. consists of a corn/soybean enterprise. He has competed on the State FFA level in Ag Mechanics, Ag Demonstration, and Agri-Science.
