### LEWISTON STUDENTS SELECTED FOR N.A.Y.I.

Two Lewiston FFA Officers were recently selected to the statewide Nebraska Agriculture Youth Institute (N.A.Y.I.). The conference will be held in Lincoln July 6 –  $10^{th}$ .

NAYI is hosted by the Nebraska Department of Agriculture and center on leadership growth and agriculture career exploration. Nebraska agriculture commodity boards are major presenters and supporters. NAYI counselors are past delegates. The counselors plan the activities for the students.

This year's theme is, "Planting Dreams – Growing Legacies". NAYI delegates are selected through an application process and ag leader recommendations. High school juniors and seniors are eligible to apply each spring.

#### LEWISTON EDUCATORS ATTEND STATE CONFERENCE

Two Lewiston Consolidated School Career Education teachers attended the 41st Nebraska Career Education (NCE) Conference June 1-4 at Kearney, Nebraska. The annual statewide conference is hosted by the Nebraska Department of Education, Nebraska Department of Career and Technical Education, and the Association of Career and Technical Educators. Family and Consumer Science, Agriculture Education, Business, Industrial Technology, Guidance, and Marketing teachers could attend.

Educators engaged in discipline sessions, heard keynote speakers, and participated in professional association activities. Lewiston Ag Education Instructor Dave Barnard and Family & Consumer Science teacher Nancy Barr participated in the conference.

Mr. Barnard served on the Ag Education district realignment committee, presented in the Ag teacher's Ideas Unlimited competition, and was recognized for media release communications. He participated in range contest and record keeping in-services, a greenhouse management session, agriculture technology updates, and a beginning teacher mentor program.

Mrs. Barr participated in a one day in-service training for an 8th grade careers class called "Engage." She attended sessions including balancing family and work, teenage brain research, technology-in-the-classroom, and program marketing, as well as professional Family and Consumer Science activities.

#### **Senior Skills**

Seniors graduated May 10 with skills needed for the transition from High School to post secondary education. I enjoyed this class of students. We finished out the semester making simple foods in the microwave. I feel they are prepared to embrace, enjoy, discover the next steps of their lives.

**Foods 2** - The Foods 2 classes chose, prepared, and presented classic desserts for the class and student body to enjoy. Each student was required to choose a recipe that showcased their culinary skills learned through the semester. They could choose a food recipe from all the categories of food prepared throughout the semester. Three chose a dessert and two had appetizers. **Projects Based Learning** - Students completed their personal projects. This class was responsible for much of the decorating for Graduation and Honor's night. They completed the semester with cleaning and inventorying the FACS room. Throughout the semester they had an opportunity to experiment with many different ideas. Some turned out great, others were a dismal failure. I feel these students learned valuable problem-solving skills for the semester.
