NOTICE CONCERNING STAFF QUALIFICATIONS

The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 gives parents the right to get information about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher. Upon request, Lewiston Consolidated Schools will provide the following information to parents:

- The status of the professional qualifications of the students' classroom teacher in regard to licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas taught, as well as the baccalaureate and advanced degrees held, and the field of certification.
- Information concerning where a teacher is teaching under emergency or provisional status through which state qualifications have been waived, and timely notice if their child has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.

ADMISSION PRICES & SENIOR CITIZEN PASSES

Admission prices for home athletic contests will remain at \$5.00 for adults and \$4.00 for non-Lewiston students this year. All Lewiston students are admitted to all home regular season events for free. Senior citizens (60 or older who live in the Lewiston school district) qualify for a free pass. If you already have a senior citizen pass, it's still valid. If you don't have one, call the school office.

BUS ROUTES

Bus times will be approximately the same as last year. If you are new to our school and are not sure if you are on one of our bus routes, please call the school. The school will contact households with route information the week prior to school starting.

EDUCATION

Handicapped children between birth and twenty-one years of age are eligible for special education services. In order to be eligible, the child must meet specific criteria for mental retardation, emotional disturbance, severe developmental delay, or be deaf, blind, or multiply handicapped. If you believe your child may qualify for this program, please contact the school administration so arrangements for diagnosis can be made. All these services are provided through the Lewiston Consolidated Schools.

REQUIRED PHYSICALS

All athletes in grades 7-12 will need to have a school physical before participating. Required forms are available in the school office. All sports physicals need to be completed and returned to the school on or before the first day of practice. Also, if you have a 6th grader going into 7th grade, they will need to have a school physical taken. Also, any new pre-school or kindergarten students or any students new to the state of Nebraska will need to provide us with a physical as well as with all current immunization records and a copy of your official birth certificate. "HANDS-ON EDUCATION" CONTINUES IN THE SUMMER

Learning through "hands-on" education does not stop at the final bell in May. Agriculture Education students are busy during the summer months with their Supervised Agriculture Experience (SAE) programs.

S.A.E.'s allow students to practice skills and knowledge developed in Lewiston classrooms and laboratories. The experiences provide wage earning opportunities, community networking, resume building, skill development and a sense of pride. Some students may choose to exhibit their SAE's at county and state fairs or shows.

SAE are broken into three types. Entrepreneurship is a common method of experience. Examples of this would be owning livestock or crops. A second type is placement. Placement enterprises would be working for a local farmer or an agri-business. The third SAE category is exploratory. This area would be like shadowing a veterinarian for a career interest.

Documentation of hours, experiences, skills and financial records are a must for a quality SAE. Most of the FFA recognition programs are based on a student's SAE. A complete agriculture education experience consists of three components; an SAE, FFA and involved instruction in the classroom and laboratory. Mr. Barnard is available to help take your experience as far as you want it.



Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Lewiston Consolidated School offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.60; lunch costs \$2.25 for PK-6 and \$2.75 for 7-12. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch. If your child(ren) qualified for free or reduced price meals at the end of last school year, you must submit a new application by **September 25, 2015** in order to avoid an interruption in meal benefits.

This packet includes an application for free or reduced price meal benefits and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS?

- All children in households receiving benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition
 Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or the
 Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within
 the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for
 free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this
 chart.
- 2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call 402-865-4675.

- 3. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. *Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household.* We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: Lewiston Consolidated School, 306 Tiger Avenue, Lewiston, NE 68380.
- 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact Mr. Rick Kentfield, 402-865-4675 immediately.
- 5. CAN I APPLY ONLINE? At this time you are unable to apply online.
- 6. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 7. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please send in an application.
- 8. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
- 9. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.



Computing Income for Self-Employed Individuals

The income to be recorded is income derived from the business venture less operating costs incurred in the generation of that income. Deductions for personal expenses, such as interest on home mortgages, medical expenses and other similar non-business items are <u>not</u> allowed in reducing gross business income.

USDA announced that **losses** (negative numbers) on the lines listed below can be used to determine the **total** income for this attachment. If the total income is a negative number, it must then be recorded as zero on the application in the category labeled "All Other Income".

Zero income resulting from the use of Form 1040 does not require follow-up.



For infants and toddlers, districts shall demonstrate targeted efforts to meet the needs of children from historically underserved populations, particularly minority, low-income, inner city and rural populations.
 - a. The Child Find requirements apply to highly mobile children with disabilities (such as migrant and homeless children); and
 - A child who is suspected of being a child with a disability and in need of special education; even though they are advancing from grade to grade.

METHODS: Efforts to locate and evaluate resident children and students with disabilities who will benefit from special education and related services will be conducted on an ongoing basis in the following ways.

- a. The district as required will conduct health and general education screenings by Nebraska state statutes and Nebraska Department of Education and Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services regulations.
- b. Child find plans will be developed and records maintained to document all such activities of the district and to evaluate their effectiveness. Such records will include a copy of all public announcements. Persons making referrals will be asked where they acquired the information that led them to the school district.
- c. The district will accept referrals for evaluation directly from parents other agencies or school personnel for children below age five who may benefit from the provision of special education services. The district will conduct periodic screening activities to locate children with disabilities.
