ACT Information

The next ACT date is as follows: April 6 -- Registration due March 4 -- Late Registration due March 18 June 11 -- Registration due May 6 -- Late Registration due May 20 Students can pick up an ACT preparation booklet from Ms. Hermsmeier's office. This booklet includes practice test questions as well as ACT testing strategies.

Senior Information

It's FAFSA Time!

If you are a college-bound senior, you must complete FAFSA (Free Application for Federal State Aid) to apply for state, federal, and college-based financial aid. Submit the form before your college's FAFSA priority date (typically between March 1 and April 1) as some financial aid is awarded first-come, first served. Check with your college(s) to learn their priority date. This is a FREE service at FAFSA.gov (if you are asked to pay, you are at the incorrect site).

Follow these steps to complete the FAFSA:

- Create a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) for you and one for a parent at fsaid.ed.gov. You'll use the ID to access the FAFSA and other Federal Student Aid websites, and as your electronic signature for the FAFSA.
- Complete your taxes early as the FAFSA requires current tax information. Within three weeks after you and your parents file your tax forms, your IRS data should be available to retrieve and transfer into your FAFSA through the IRS Data Retrieval process (available as of February 7, 2016).

Gather these student and parent items:

- 2015 federal income tax forms and, if applicable, Schedule K-1 (Form 1065)
- 2015 W-2 forms
- Student driver's license number
- Social Security numbers
- Birth dates
- · Date parents were married, separated, divorced, or widowed
- Current cash, savings, and checking account balances
- Current investment values (stocks, bonds, mutual funds, CDs, etc.) excluding your home and retirement accounts
- · Value of business (if more than 100 employees)
- Value of investment farm (Do not include the value of a family farm that you or your parents live on and operate.)
- 2015 child support (paid and/or received)
- 2015 Workers' Compensation
- · Other untaxed income in 2015 such as housing/food/living allowances for military and clergy
- Alien Registration Number for eligible non-citizens
- Be prepared to indicate on the FAFSA if during 2015, you or anyone in your household received Supplemental Security Income, SNAP, TANF, Free or Reduced Lunch, and/or WIC.
- Complete the FAFSA at FAFSA.gov . The colleges you list on the application should receive the results within 48 hours.


Other Scholarship Information

It's that time of year again to prepare for bad weather. This system will send a text to each of the phone numbers you have registered with the school for contact purposes. It is important to remember two items when late starts occur. First, buses will run according to the announced late start. If a "2 hour late start" is announced, plan on the buses running two hours later than normal. Secondly, always error on the side of caution when determining rather to allow your child to drive to and from school when road conditions are questionable. Safety is priority one.

Parents will complete ALL necessary paperwork and visit with the classroom teacher while the children are involved in activities.

After reviewing all paperwork, you will be contacted by mail regarding your child's eligibility for the 2016-17 school year at Lewiston.

Nebraska law requires all Pre-K students to have a physical exam signed by a physician and an eye exam by an optometrist within six months before school starts.

Lewiston FFA Announces 2nd Quarter Honor Roll


