Welcome to second semester from the FACS room. Classes have changed. Students have completed Drop and Add. New experiences await the students in the classes this semester.

7th Grade Study Skills - There are six 7th grade girls learning better studying skills such as a new ways of studying for tests, taking notes, and memorization They will also touch on learning basic social skills. This class is for third quarter only so there will be a lot to learn in a short time.
