LEWISTON AG EDUCATION STUDENTS ATTEND RANGE CONTEST

Seven Lewiston Ag Education students turned in a good showing at the Area 6 Range Management Contest in Johnson County on September 17^h.

The contest was hosted by the Johnson County NRCS, the Nemaha NRD and the Johnson County Extension Service. Students competed in two divisions, a junior division or a senior division. Each team was made up of three or four students. Students evaluated three sites for degree of use, condition and site name. They took a written quiz and reviewed a range management map and made recommendations. The contestants then identified 24 plants from a list of over 150 plants and gave characteristics such as life span, forage value and growth response for each.

Ag Education Departments competing were from Tri-County, Diller-Odell, Sterling, Blair, Blue Hill, Aurora, Ashland-Greenwood, Auburn, Conestoga and Lewiston. To earn a ribbon a student must be in the top 1/4 of the judgers.

The Lewiston junior division team of Karen Keyes, Megan Wehrbein, Skyler Salts and Cari Howell placed 8th out of 26 teams. There were 104 junior division contestants. Megan and Skyler earned ribbons. Cari and Karen were in the top third in the judging.

In the Senior division, the team of Brooke Wehrbein, Nick Seeman and Richard Kendall placed 4th out of 18 teams. Each member received a white team ribbon. Brooke and Richard tied for 13th place and each received a ribbon. There were 67 senior judgers.

The next Ag Education activity for Lewiston schools is the Southeast Area Land Judging Competition on Oct. 1st in Richardson County.







LEWISTON AG EDUCATION WINS AREA LAND JUDGING

Seven southeast area schools competed in the Area Land Judging Contest held on Wed. October 1st. The competition was an Ag Education State Qualifying event to be held at McCook, Nebraska on October 22nd.

The contest consists of evaluating four sites for soil depth, surface texture, subsoil permeability, slope %, surface thickness and erosion. Students then determine the Land Capability Class and recommend land treatments including soil amendments and fertilizer.

The competition was conducted by the Nemaha NRD and area Natural Resource Conservation Service (N.R.C.S.). Schools competing were Johnson County Central, Lewiston, Tri-County, Diller-Odell, Palmyra, Fall City and Pawnee City. One hundred and twenty students competed.

Team Lewiston of Cari Howell, Karen Keyes, Megan Wehrbein and Skyler Salts won the Area Championship and qualified for state. This team received a purple team ribbon and a plaque. Johnson County Central finished as area runner-ups. The Lewiston team of Brooke Wehrbein, Richard Kendall, Tyler Keyes and Trevor Husa finished in third place and earned a purple team ribbon. Palmyra finished fourth and earned a purple team ribbon.

Individually, Cari Howell of Lewiston was the Area Champion and earned a purple ribbon and Karen Keyes finished as runner-up with a purple. Other ribbon winners from Lewiston were Megan Wehrbein, 5th purple; Richard Kendall, 9th Blue; Tyler Keyes, 10th Blue; Trevor Husa, 24th Red; Skyler Salts, 27th Red and Nick Seeman, 30th and a red ribbon.

The next activity for Lewiston Ag Education students is helping with the Rural Safety Elementary Day at the Gage Co. Fairgrounds on Oct. 9th.

LEWISTON ELEMENTARY STUDENTS ATTEND SAFETY DAY

Local students attended a Progressive Agriculture Safety Day on October 9th at the Gage Co. Fairgrounds. The event was hosted by the Lewiston FFA Chapter and the Gage Co. Extension Service. One hundred and thirty students participated.

Lewiston 3rd and 4th graders participated in eleven rural safety sessions. Lewiston FFA members were student presenters and group leaders. Students from Wymore Southern, Diller-Odell, St. Paul's of Plymouth and St. Joseph's also attended. Mrs. Tracie Wehrbein and Mrs. Mary Beth Tuttle are the Lewiston teachers. Lewiston FFA Advisor Dave Barnard was the event coordinator.

Sessions included Chemical Look-Alikes, Animal Safety, Firearm Safety, Internet Awareness, Healthy Lifestyles, Underground Hazards, Operation Lifesaver Train Safety, Basic CPR, Grain Safety, and Lawn Equipment Safety. The noon program was an electrical safety program presented by Norris Public Power District.

Each student was given a safety bag full of promotions and reminders of the special day plus a Safety T-shirt. Plymouth, NE native, Mr. Greg Fanders started the day with a personal accident story. He told the students about his experience in losing three fingers when he was seven years old. He stressed the need to avoid dangerous situations, think things through, and don't be in such a hurry.
