## Superintendent's Message

Six years ago a commitment was made by the board of education and Lewiston alumni Dr. Curt Wischmeier and his wife Susan to start a 4 year old pre-school program. The goal at that time was to increase the number of students attending elementary at Lewiston and to provide educational opportunities for pre-school age students. The impact of that initiative and the board's decision last year to expand early childhood programming, again with the generosity of Dr. Curt & Susan Wischmeier has resulted in the number of early childhood students in pre-school and Kindergarten reaching an all time high, with the Kindergarten class now holding the distinction of being the largest class in the district.

To continue increasing the number of students attending the district and improve academic offerings the board of education passed a motion at their August board meeting to approve a 1.2 million dollar facility improvement project. The project will include the addition of two new early childhood classrooms, science room, art room, and life safety systems. Preliminary plans for funding the project will include a \$250,000 anonymous donation, approximately \$300,000 levied in the Special Building Fund, and approximately \$500,000 levied in the QCPUF Fund. The number of years the project will be financed has yet to be determined by the board of education. Drawings of the new facilities may be viewed and picked up at the school office.

Another exciting change for the district is the new web page. Starting September 2<sup>nd</sup> access to the district's new web page can be located at [www.lewistonconsolidated.org](http://www.lewistonconsolidated.org). I encourage you to tour the site and become familiar with its content. As we progress through the school year, teachers, administration, school related organizations, and links to important sources of information will be added to the site. The new web page will provide you all the news, scheduling, and data information necessary to stay informed.

Lastly, once again the news media has reminded us of the importance of transporting children to and from school safely. The district's bus drivers and administration review and revise current practice and procedures to ensure student safety. I would like to encourage parents to take time to discuss these safe transportation related rules with your children. A few important rules to remember while riding the bus are listed on the next page and a complete listing of transportation information is included in your child's student handbook. Parental support is a key ingredient for keeping our students safe on the bus.


## Superintendent's Message \*continued\*

### WHILE RIDING THE SCHOOL BUS

- The driver is in full charge of the bus and the students. Students shall comply promptly and cheerfully with the drivers requests.
- Upon entering the bus, the student shall immediately be seated. The driver may assign seats to the students. Seats may not be reserved by students. Students are to remain seated. Arms and legs are not to be extended into the aisle.
- Outside of ordinary conversation, classroom conduct is to be observed by students. Any pupil who is guilty of unbecoming conduct may forfeit the right to ride on the bus.
- During the bus trip, students must remain in their seats.
- Teasing, scuffling, grabbing, hitting or using hands, feet or body in an inappropriate manner which can cause distraction or injury to occupants of the bus is not permitted.
- No part of a student's body shall be extended through a bus window. Windows and doors are opened or closed only by permission of the bus driver.
- Damage to the bus by a student shall be reported to the driver. In cases of malicious damage, the school district expects to be compensated for the damage.
- Students wishing to ride the bus on a temporary basis are required to get permission from the principal's office by submitting a written request stating the date, time, and reason for the request prior to boarding.
- It is important to remember that pick up times may vary depending on the number of students riding each day. The number of students riding each day "does" vary and this "does" impact times, please be advised of this fact and plan accordingly.

Lastly, one of the most important factors regarding the safety of our children is communication. The administration encourages bus drivers to keep the lines of communication open with parents regarding day to day occurrences on the bus when necessary and we encourage parents to contact bus drivers and administration anytime you have questions or concerns.

The purpose of this newsletter is to provide basic information for the Lewiston Consolidated School District that will keep all citizens informed on important school procedures, issues, and facts. This newsletter will be distributed to all patrons on the Lewiston Consolidated School mail routes. Mr. Robison sponsored an officer outing to Lincoln where six members enjoyed laser tag in July.


