Anderson Receives American FFA Degree

Dalton Anderson of Virginia, Nebraska, recently received his American FFA Degree at the 2017 National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana. Anderson, a 2016 graduate of Lewiston Consolidated School, was one of 154 Nebraskans and 4,071 total FFA members to receive the highest degree an FFA member can achieve. Applicants were screened and approved by the FFA Board of National Officers and Directors. Less than 1 percent of FFA members advance through chapter and

state FFA degrees to earn this national degree. Achieving this goal required years of hard work and commitment. Dalton's advisors while at Lewiston were Mr. John Robison and Mr. David Barnard. The last Lewiston graduate to receive the distinguished American Degree was in 2003. Dalton is the son of Spencer and Jeanine Anderson.



SENIORS

Have you visited your top colleges? If you haven't done so already, visit your top college choices soon!

- **Contact the admissions** office at least two weeks in advance to schedule your visit. Make appointments with an admissions rep, financial aid counselor, and a faculty member in the area of study that interests you.
- **Check out the college website** before you visit. You can learn about the school's admissions process, types of majors, student services, etc.
- **Visit while school is in session** to get a true snapshot of the school.
- **Get a feel for the campus.** Take your time to explore the campus and sites nearby.
- **Ask LOTS of questions!** (See the EducationQuest College Prep Handbook or website for good questions to ask)

New College Timeline will keep you on track to college

EducationQuest has launched a new College Timeline for students in grades 9-12 that spells out steps you should take during fall, winter, spring, and summer to plan for college.

The Timeline also allows you to add your own tasks, get reminders when it's time to complete tasks, and check off tasks when they're complete. You can access these features by creating and/or logging into your MyEducationQuest account at EducationQuest.org.

Winning the scholarship game

Follow these tips to increase your chances of earning scholarships:

Don't ever pay for scholarship searches! Use *free* resources such as [ScholarshipQuest](#) at EducationQuest.org with over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. Free national sites include [Peterson's](#), [FindTuition](#), [Cappex](#), and [Chegg](#).

Visit your school counselor often for information about local scholarships.

Focus on local and college-specific scholarships because you're more likely to earn them.

Update your activities, honors, community service or paid jobs using the [Activities Resume](#) at EducationQuest.org.

Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exam in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.

Use quality references such as a teacher, coach or counselor. Encourage them to write specific examples of your leadership skills. Give them advance notice and a specific deadline.

Tailor your essay to the scholarship. Ask an English teacher to read your essay and offer advice on making a big impact. Your essay will need to stand out from other applications.
