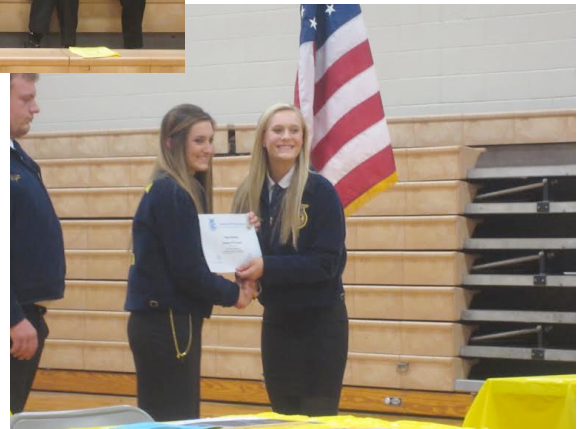

LEWISTON FFA RECEIVES FARM CREDIT GRANT

The Lewiston FFA Chapter was awarded a FCS “Working Here Grant” for \$2,000.00 this week. Mrs. Jessica Larsen of the Beatrice Farm Credit Service presented the check to Chapter officers on May 12th.

The grant will implement the agriculture education student’s “Learn by Growing” project. Two vertical hydroponic tower gardens will be purchased. The units include nutrient solutions, dollies, wool rock, lighting, and plant holders. The units will grow vegetables to supplement the Lewiston Schools cafeteria.

The tower units have proven to yield 30% more produce three times quicker than standard greenhouse conditions. The units are set to operate year round. Each unit holds 28 plants. The “Seed to Plate” educational experience teaches plant morphology and all aspects of growth. The Lewiston elementary students will be involved in the project.

The Lewiston FFA Chapter is very appreciative of Farm Credit Service’s continued support of rural Nebraska youth.



NPOWER LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

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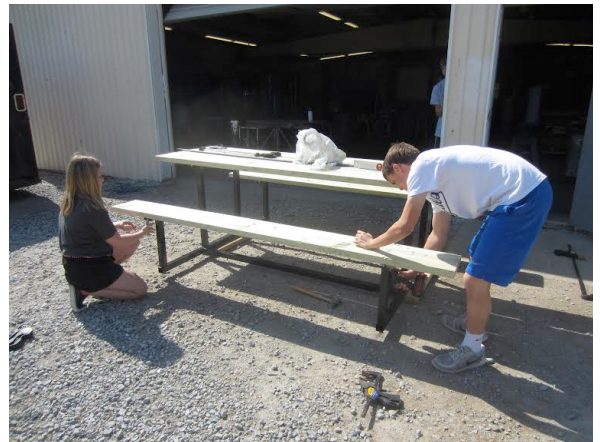


MAY AG EDUCATION DEPT. NEWS SHORTS
