#### TEST FEES

Registration for the ACT without writing is \$46.00.

ACT with writing costs \$62.50.

## “Wild West Book Fair” is Best Ever!

The “Wild West Book Fair: Saddle Up and Read!” was VERY successful. The sales were \$3,009.51, which was more than \$500 past our goal!

This has been our best book fair ever. The Scholastic formula says our sales would account for 601 books sold and breaks down to 108,324 minutes of reading!

By reaching the goal, we were able to get \$1650 worth of books for our classrooms and the library. Students were rewarded for reaching the goal with a hayride around Lewiston with Norm Flesner on October 13.

We collected \$522.27 in the All for Books challenge. This money was also used for Lewiston classroom libraries. Scholastic matches these funds and sends books to schools that have been damaged by storms. The third graders collected the most money: \$163.08. They got to lasso Ms. Bowen. The PTO was great help as volunteers with book sales and sharing “western” snacks with the Lewiston staff.

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## Plum Creek Literacy Festival is Enjoyed by Students

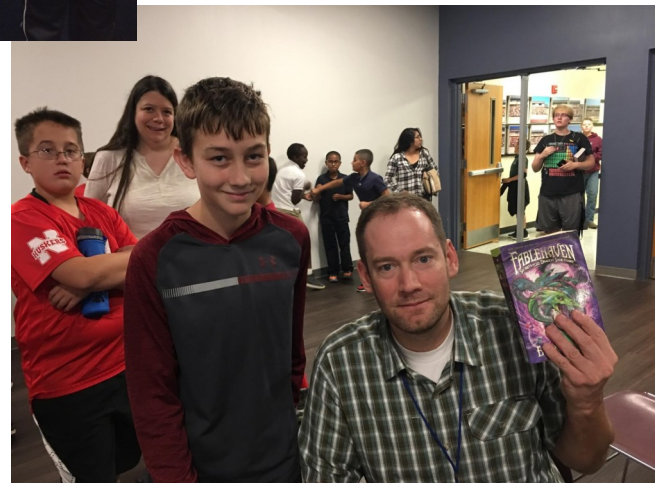

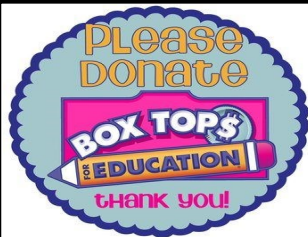
