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FLU SHOT CLINIC

It is time to think about getting our flu shots again this year. Influenza is a highly contagious respiratory illness caused by the influenza virus. It spreads from person to person via airborne droplets when someone sneezes or coughs. Influenza can lead to pneumonia, dehydration, and worsening of chronic diseases, especially for those with lung and heart problems. There is a strong possibility of missing school for several days once inflenza symptoms set in.



The school strongly encourages all staff and students to receive a flu shot. We are going to make it easy for you to do so. The Pawnee Health Clinic will be at Lewiston Consolidated Schools on **Thursday, October 5th from 8:30 – 9:30 A.M.** to administer flu shots to students and staff. Please bring your insurance card and the clinic will submit a claim for you, otherwise you will need to pay \$25 for the shot. Please make checks payable to Pawnee County Rural Health Clinic. Medicaid insurance is only accepted at the Pawnee County Rural Health Clinic in Pawnee City.

Please read the flu vaccination administration release form on the back if you would like a flu shot and return it the morning of the vaccination clinic.

October "To Do" List

- 2. Print the barcode and take it to the fair so that college reps can scan it. This will save time spent completing college information cards.

Winning the scholarship game

Follow these tips to increase your chances of earning scholarships:

Don't pay for scholarship services! Free resources include <u>ScholarshipQuest</u> at EducationQuest.org, your school counselor's office, and EducationQuest offices in Omaha, Lincoln, and Kearney.

Focus on college-based and local scholarships. You're more likely to earn them over large national awards.

Continually update your activities, honors, and volunteer or paid jobs using the *Activities Resume* at EducationQuest.org.

Earn the best possible ACT scores by taking the exam in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.

Use quality references such as a teacher, coach or counselor. Give them advance notice, a specific deadline, and a copy of your Activities Resume.

Ask at least two people to proofread your application.

Seniors - Have you visited your top colleges?

If you haven't done so already, visit your college choices soon as application deadlines will start hitting this fall. Follow these tips for a successful visit:

- ⇒ Contact the admissions office at least two weeks in advance to schedule your visit. Make appointments with an admissions representative, financial aid counselor, and a faculty member in the area of study that interests you.
- ⇒ **Check out the college website before you visit**. Most college sites have a section for prospective students where you can learn about the school's admissions process, types of majors, student services, and employment opportunities. You might even be able to schedule your visit online.
- ⇒ **Visit while school is in session**. You won't get the true flavor during breaks or finals week.
- ⇒ **Get a feel for the campus**. Hang out in the student union, find coffee shops with wireless internet access, eat in a restaurant close to campus or attend athletic or cultural events.
- ⇒ **Ask LOTS of questions!** See the EducationQuest College Prep Handbook or website for good questions to ask.

All Nebraska high school juniors will take the ACT college entrance exam this spring!
The John Baylor ACT prep course will be offered to all Lewiston juniors.

ACT with writing costs \$62.50.

A month has gone by and students are settling in for the semester's work. The end of the quarter is coming up soon.

 8^{th} grade students completed a cooking unit. They prepared simple snacks that are quick and easy to prepare and eat within the class hour.

My two embroidery workers are finishing up a volleyball order and working on a second order for the Booster Club. They are learning how to digitize and edit their work. They have had to problem solve several designs to make them work on the machines.

The Junior High Study Skills class learned how to carry a conversation with peers, adults, and how to ask for help. These students were introduced to "Genius Hour", an opportunity to explore their passions and interests.

Sixth Period Quick and Easy Foods class are preparing recipes in two groups at a time. It is a challenge to prepare food with half the class and keep the rest of the class busy with review work. They started with appetizers, moved to dips, sandwiches, and quick breads.

The design elements and principles are encouraging the Introduction to Design class to look at design in many different ways. They completed a fabric unit and a fabric project. This was followed by working with each of the elements and principles of design daily.

The 8th Period Problem-Based-Learning class is a lively class. Many different projects are going on in the room at the same time. A couple of projects were completed outside in the good weather. Inside projects range from food projects to paper projects to refinishing a chair.
