You can tell he admires what Rosa Parks did by ring fr. tou can tell he admires what Rose Parks slid by simply not guing up her bus sead, but Wilson seys he is no civil rights extrivit. In fact, Wilson may be a robustant civil rights extrict, but make no mistales, by leading with humili-by and example, he premeted equality for African Americans in the smallest of rural settings.

This is the journey of Wilson Fitzpatrick. It begins in Kansas City, Kansas where he was born during the depression. His family meed to Marshall, Misseari when he was still a body. He had strong parents, but Marshall effered far less for African Americans than Kansas City.

His athletic skills gave him opportunities in the Air Force and at the University of Nebraska. He found that Papil-lion was not ready for a black coach, but he found acceptance in the small, rural community of Lewiston


His journey continues to this day. Listen to the stories his grateful students tell. All these years later, they still celeb this outstanding educator and civil rights activist.

## Lewiston School Foundation To Kick Off Fund Raising Activities For New Ag Education Facility

Dear Patrons.......Every month we look forward to articles dedicated to the activities, projects and accomplishments of this group of kids. Our students have demonstrated significant success recently in area and State FFA competitions. FFA is about developing personalities, character, and a sense of values that will serve its members for the rest of their lives.

The majority of the education these kids receive takes place in our current Ag Education building located to the east of the main building. This building has served us well, however, has become outdated. The perimeter walls and the roll up door on the north side are no longer tall enough to accommodate Ag equipment in use today. The building is somewhat out of place now that we have completed the aesthetically pleasing preschool, art and science addition to the school.

At a recent Lewiston School Foundation meeting, we discussed the possibility of building a new Ag Education facility. The addition would not only provide more space and updated facilities but would also be connected to the school, providing a more secure environment for our students and would not force them to go out in inclement weather to get to class. This concept was well received, by the Board of Education. As happy as we are with results of the new addition, we are all aware of the increased financial burden the new addition and the current economy have on all of us.


As we set out to pursue this endeavor, it was determined that we will have to seek funding through fund raisers and private donations. We have contacted the Nebraska Community Foundation, who provided \$250,000 from an anonymous donor in the Preschool, Art and Science rooms addition, and they are

very interested in the construction of the new Ag Education facility. I might add that the NCF is encouraged and supportive when the community participates and demonstrates enthusiasm in the sponsorship of the project. The School Foundation has spent a significant amount of time discussing ideas for raising funds for the new building as well and will be kicking off these initiatives in the fall of 2018.

The School Foundation has received several donations that have been ear marked for the new Ag Education facility. The Foundation Board hired local architect Michael Fakler to create conceptual drawings illustrating the new building as it would reside next to the school. These drawings have been completed and the building has been dimensioned at 56'x 100.' The building provides modern class room facilities as well as adequate space for welding and wood shop activities along with a 16' high roll up door to accommodate modern ag equipment. An anonymous donor has awarded the school 20 thousand dollars to assist with the construction drawings required for this project. We are highly encouraged with the activities of the Ag Education and FFA programs and feel we need to give the students and their educator the tools they need to continue to be successful. # James Shuey - Class of 1962

Jim credits his education at Lewiston Consolidated Schools and its dedicated teachers for providing him the framework for the wisdom, knowledge and insight that served him well his entire adult life. Jim credits LHS educators such as Mr. Wilson Fitzpatrick, Mrs. Merna Wischmeier and Mr. Glenn Heideman for preparing him for his at then unknown future with an invaluable work and moral ethic.

Jim served in the United States Air Force until 1966 as an Autopilot and Avionics Specialist. The skills he learned in the Air Force served him well in his professional career, working for the electronics, aircraft and communications companies HyGain Electronics, Lincoln Aerospace, Boeing, AT&T and Lucent. He has received many professional awards in his career including the Distinguished Service Award from the Communications Workers of America.

While Jim was stationed with AT&T in Lyons, Nebraska, he started their first Jaycee Chapter, was a member of the Volunteer Fire Department for 14 years and a city council member. Jim is a member of the Masonic Organization.

Dedication to the military and veterans continued as Jim worked in support of the Disabled American Veterans and has served in positions such as State Adjutant, State Legislative Director, Nebraska Veterans Council, Veterans Service Officer, National Committee for Hospital and Voluntary Services. He is currently on the National Executive Committee representing the states of Iowa, Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska.

James parents were the late Shannon and Viola Shuey. He has a twin sister Judy and brothers Dave and Harold. Jim is married to wife JoAnn and are the parents of daughter Mychelle (Galen) Fada, have two granddaughters (Whitney & Morgyn) and two great-grandsons (Jaxsyn and Madyx).

# James Reierson - Class of 1959

Jim grew up on a farm near Crab Orchard where he attended grade school with his brother Jerry. He came to LHS as a freshman in 1954 and graduated from Lewiston Consolidated School in 1959 as Valedictorian. James mother, Mary Lou, taught grade school, and father (Vern) farmed until 1959 when he owned/ran Lewiston Grocery.

Jim attended UNL where he received a Bachelors degree in Physics in 1963. He received his Ph.D. in Nuclear Physics from Iowa State University in 1969 and his Master's in Business Administration from Marymount College in 1984.

From 1973-1975, Jim was a Peace Corps volunteer serving as a Lecturer in Physics in Fiji. He taught courses in physics and mathematics and help design and install terminals for the USP Satellite Communications Project.

Jim joined the MITRE Corporation (a nonprofit that manages Federally Funded Research and Development) in 1978, serving as Lead Staff, working on the design of computer software for Air Traffic Control for the FAA. He also worked on systems engineering in support of the FAA Oceanic Systems manager, helped develop and test a Flight Data Processing Prototype. He has received two certificates of commendation for his contributions. Jim has also worked for the Raytheon Systems Company (formerly Hughes Aircraft) as Senior Scientist & Engineer.

Dr. Reierson retired in 2006. He worked on a part-time basis from 2009-2015 for Nobilis, a nonprofit science, technology and strategy organization. In retirement, Jim has been a volunteer mentor for high school students. Jim is married to his wife Polly and lives in Arlington, Virginia. They have two grown children and three grandchildren.
