Six Lewiston FFA members competed in the district FFA Leadership Development Events on January 18th. The events were held virtually across southeast Nebraska.

Emma de Koning and Masyn Arena both qualified for the state competitions in their respective events. Emma was selected as the district champion in junior public speaking, while Masyn earned runner-up honors in senior public speaking. Both will present their speeches during the virtual State FFA Convention this spring.

Becca de Koning placed third in natural resources speaking, earning a state alternate spot. Ty Arena won a blue ribbon for his natural resources speech. Kelsay Bledsaw received a red ribbon in employment skills. Leah Christen received a red ribbon in creed speaking.

Lewiston FFA members will compete in district Career Development events in February and March. The first of those will be the poultry evaluation and judging event on February 24th.

National FFA week is February 20-27. Lewiston FFA members are planning on hosting activities for Lewiston students, faculty, and staff. Activities include student dress-up days, childrens' barnyard, games, and teacher appreciation breakfast.

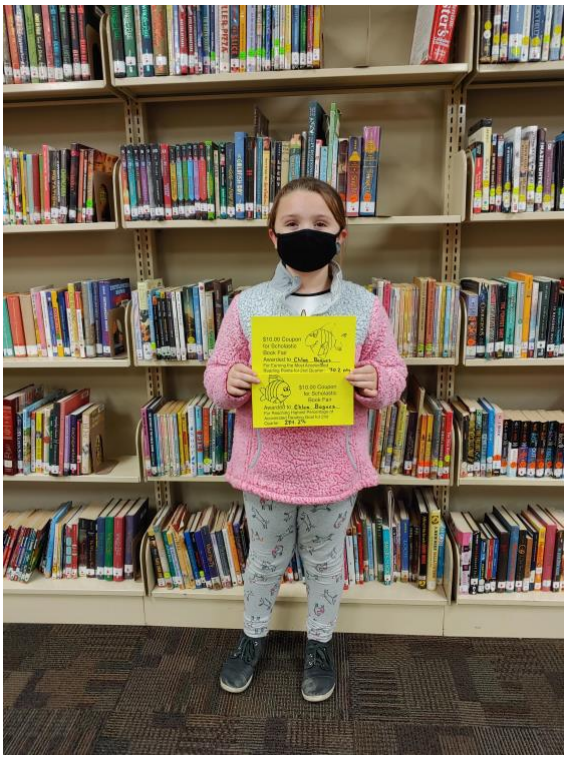

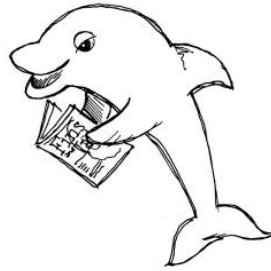

## Seniors...make sure you complete the FAFSA process

Getting financial aid for college involves more than completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Complete each step of the process so that you don't miss out on money for college.

1. **If you haven't already, complete your 2021-22 FAFSA** at studentaid.gov using 2019 income tax data. Before you start, you and a parent must each create a Student Aid account. If you need help with your FAFSA, contact EducationQuest to set up a **free** virtual appointment.
2. **Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR) via an email link.** The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and lets you know if you need to take further action before the form can be processed.
3. **You might receive a verification notice** from the college(s) you listed on your FAFSA requesting documents to verify your FAFSA information. The college will not process your financial aid until you provide required documents.
4. **Watch for financial aid award notifications.** Once you're accepted for admission to the colleges you listed on your FAFSA, they will notify you of the types and amounts of financial aid they're offering.

\* If you miss the regular deadline, you can register during the late period but must pay the additional nonrefundable late fee.

NOTE: All materials sent by mail must be RECEIVED by the last date of the late period, regardless of when they are postmarked. If students are wishing to register at school, he/she must have their social security number and a credit card to pay for registration.

### TEST FEES

Registration for the ACT without writing is \$55.00.  
ACT with writing costs \$70.00.

Juniors and Seniors qualifying for F/R Lunch may see Mrs. Houston for a fee waiver.



### What you need to know about scholarships

Most scholarships are based on academics, but others are based on community service, school involvement, or talent. Some are based on financial need as determined by the results of your FAFSA.

#### Here's where to look for scholarships:

1. *ScholarshipQuest* at [EducationQuest.org](http://EducationQuest.org) houses over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. After you create a profile, you'll be matched with scholarships that fit your criteria. You'll also find links to national sites that *EducationQuest* recommends.
2. Your school counselor's office. Watch for emails from Mrs. Houston about scholarships.
3. The college you plan to attend. Contact the school for a list of scholarships they provide and the application procedures.
4. Other resources could include your coach, clubs and organizations, and your parents' employers and civic organizations.

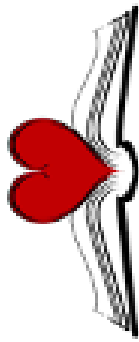
## ~ ALL ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS ~



### Follow these tips!

- Organize scholarships in deadline order and set aside time each week to work on them.
- Focus on college-based and local scholarships. You're more likely to earn them over large national awards.
- On the application, list your activities, awards, honors classes and volunteer or paid jobs. Track them using the Activities Resume from *EducationQuest*.
- Earn the best possible ACT scores by taking the exam in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.
- If an application requires a letter of recommendation, give the person writing the letter plenty of notice, a specific deadline, and a list of your accomplishments and activities.
- After writing an essay, ask an English teacher to review it.
- Don't ever pay for scholarship services!

# FROM THE CORNER ROOM

February 2021

A new semester means new classes or different students for the second semester.

**Home Living** – Students use the information they learned in Intro to Design and apply it to home decorating. Floor Plans are studied and evaluated to determine ease of living. Elements and Principles of design are reviewed before learning how to give a room style.

**Foods Class** – Subjects that are covered in second semester build on learning from first semester. January started out with a review of kitchen and food safety. Soups, sandwiches, and casseroles finished out the month. Breakfast sandwiches were a great hit as well as skillet casseroles.

**Textiles** – Different students enrolling in Textiles this semester are the basics of pattern layout, hand sewing stitches, and how to determine fabric content. They are learning construction methods as they design and sew their projects.

**Project-Based Learning** – Four students joined PBL at semester. Projects range from sewing to digital to wood projects. Students are learning to stretch themselves. “I can do this!” is heard over and over.

**Senior Skills** – Twelve seniors are learning skills that will help them transition from high school to the real world outside our doors. We started with job skills – applications, resumes, interviews as the first unit. Thanks to the generous donations of two banks, Main Street Bank of Virginia and First State Bank of Burchard, our seniors are learning financial management skills through Dave Ramsey’s Financial Foundation software. This course is being taught with co-teacher, Kyle Asche.

**Child Development** – Sixth Period Child Development is beginning the pregnancy unit. They are learning how diet and exercise are the keys to a healthy pregnancy. They also looked at how vulnerable the baby is to alcohol, drugs, and some medications in the first weeks of pregnancy.

**Independent FACS-** At the end of the day six students report for a time of learning new skills. Two students are a part of the Embroidery business and the remaining four are learning different facets of FACS. They have completed a week of cooking, a week of design, and a week of learning new digital skills
