

## Wrapping up your senior year

Seniors...stay on track to college by completing these second-semester tasks:

**Complete the financial aid process.** By now, you should have completed your FAFSA. If you haven't, do so at [studentaid.gov](http://studentaid.gov). If your college requests verification of your FAFSA information, submit required documents so that the school can award your financial aid.

**Watch your student portal and email closely.** Once you're accepted for admission, the colleges you listed on your FAFSA will notify you of the financial aid they're offering.

**Keep your grades up.** If you get poor grades this semester, your college could revoke your admission.

**Apply for scholarships.** See *ScholarshipQuest* at [EducationQuest.org](http://EducationQuest.org) for Nebraska-based scholarships. You'll also find links to national scholarship sites.

**Make your final college selection.** Notify the other colleges so they can take you off their mailing list.

**Be aware of deadlines** to accept financial aid and college admission offers, submit your housing deposit, and register for new-student orientation.

### Juniors...it's time to narrow your college choices.

Narrow your college choices soon to prepare for these upcoming activities:

**ACT Test.** When you take the ACT this spring, you'll be asked to provide a list of colleges that should receive your score.

**Completion of the FAFSA** early next fall. You and your parents can complete the FAFSA beginning October 1 of your senior year. The colleges you list on the form will receive the results.

**College applications.** Early next fall, it will be time to apply to your top college choices.


\* If you miss the regular deadline, you can register during the late period but must pay the additional nonrefundable late fee.  
NOTE: All materials sent by mail must be RECEIVED by the last date of the late period, regardless of when they are postmarked. If students are wishing to register at school, he/she must have their social security number and a credit card to pay for registration.

#### TEST FEES

Registration for the ACT without writing is \$55.00.

ACT with writing costs \$70.00.

# FROM THE CORNER ROOM

March 2021



Hello Spring!

I am so excited that Spring is here or almost here! March has so many interesting days ahead – St. Patrick's Day, First Official Day of Spring, and Easter! There is so much to look forward to.

Home Living Class explored window treatments and wall treatments. This class learned the different types of window treatments for rooms in a home. The wall treatments covered paint and wallpaper techniques.

PBL students are finding projects and learning new skills. Students are to find one project to do for the school or community for each quarter. Those should be completed by the middle of March.

Foods 2 students learned about yeast breads the end of February. They were challenged to prepare recipes with a variety of types of breads. Breadsticks, bagels, cinnamon rolls, dinner rolls were learning experiences for the students.

Textile students completed class projects including a pillowcase, a zipper pouch, hand warmers, and learned how to recycle an old garment into something new. Students from last semester sewed a backpack, learned to make bias tape, and put together non-slip pads for the sewing machine foot pedals.

Child Development students discovered in a small way how much care a newborn baby needs by completing a baby simulation. Students were required to care for a simulated baby for three days and two nights. The purpose of this stimulation is for students to realize that they may be wonderful parents in the future but are not quite ready at this time in their lives to be a parent.

The seniors in Senior Skills covered information two chapters of Ramsey Classroom which introduced them to the Five Foundations Action Plan and Budgeting. Students learned that money management is 20% knowledge and 80% behavior. They also completed a unit on relationships focusing on healthy and unhealthy relationships.

The Independent FAC class focused on preparing sandwiches. They learned about a variety of types of sandwiches. Upon completion of that unit, they moved into a unit of working with batik.

Embrace Embroidery students worked on a design for a company to be used on shirts and hats. They learned how to create the design using software on the computer. It was a trial-and-error piece of work as they learned that just creating the design does not always mean it will sew out well. They finished up a large order of hats for a local company and worked on some small projects as well.


