### RETURN LIBRARY BOOKS! Please send all library books to school by May 12.

Twelve Lewiston students participated in the first ever Golden Reader Competition at the Pawnee Public Library April 14. The competition was between Lewiston and Pawnee Public School.

The division I team received first place and answered every question correctly! Division II received second place with division III receiving third. Debbie Goossen was the coach for each team.

For the past 18 years, a total of 120 Lewiston students competed in the Nebraska Reading Classic competition. Due to the large number of books on each division's reading list (60-65 on each), it was decided by Lewiston and Pawnee to start a competition using only the ten Golden Sower books for each division.

Each year a new set of Golden Sower books is chosen by librarians across the state for students to vote on in the spring. There are ten books in the picture book (grade 3), chapter book (grades 4-5) and novel book (grades 6-8) categories.

As in the Reading Classic competition, each Golden Reader division's contest consisted of five rounds of 10 questions each. The teams whispered the answers and recorded them on a sheet of paper that was then judged.



May 2021

May is here and graduation is near! The seniors are finishing up their Ramsey Classroom, a financial curriculum that teaches seniors about financial decisions they will be making in their near future.

The Independent FACS class completed their learning units and are not discovering their interests and passions by completing independent projects. Projects they are interested in include food preparation, crafts, room accessories, and preparing displays for graduation.

The Child Development class is working with SEL (Social emotional Learning) skills as they apply to children and to themselves. Skills such as self-awareness, social awareness, decision-making, and taking responsibility will be as important for them to learn for themselves as well as for a younger child.

Textile students are completing a variety of projects. Projects include restructuring a garment, sewing fabric letters, and sewing a pair of shorts. Each of these projects require skill with hand sewing and machine sewing. These students take their time on their projects and they will turn out great!

Students feel like they are preparing food every day in class. They have been preparing recipes using only what we have on hand in the cupboards and refrigerator. This has been a good exercise in adjusting recipes to smaller amounts for them as well as the teacher! Individual finals will be prepared in the next two weeks.

Home Living is getting ready to decorate and furnish a home. This will cover everything studied this semester including room arrangement, wall and window treatments, floor coverings, lighting, furniture, and accessories. Floorplanner.com is the app that is used in class to complete these assignments.

Embrace Embroidery students are spending their class periods experimenting with different design details in their Design Shop app to enhance basic designs.

A regular meeting of the District 69 Board of Education, Pawnee County, was held on Wednesday, April 14<sup>th</sup>, at 7:30 p.m., the meeting being open to the public and proceeded in notice as required by law. Notice of this meeting was given to the President and all members of the Board and a copy of the acknowledgement of notice and the agenda is noted in the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated to the public in advanced notice and to the President of the Board and all Board members.

The meeting was called to order, the Open Meetings Law poster recognized, and verbal notice that the meeting was recorded was given by the President and on a roll call vote, the following members were present: Rule, Schuster, Searcey, Thomas and Wehrbein. Excused Absence: Sisco. Also present: Rick Kentfield, Juli Smith, Linda Thomas, and visitors.

The agenda was reviewed. Moved by Thomas and seconded by Searcey "to approve the agenda as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Schuster, Searcey, Thomas, Wehrbein, Rule. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Visitors were welcomed. Linda Searcey, board member, complimented the juniors, seniors and sponsors for a nice prom. A visitor mentioned that they hoped the board would consider re-starting the student representative program again next year.

Moved by Schuster and seconded by Wehrbein "to approve the minutes of the March 15, 2021, regular school board meeting and the March 29, 2021, board workshop meeting as presented." Moved by Searcey and seconded by Schuster "to approve Rebecca Worthey's resignation as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Wehrbein, Rule, Schuster, Searcey, Thomas. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Moved by Wehrbein and seconded by Searcey "to approve Mathilda Fehringer's employment agreement for the 2021-2022 school year as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Rule, Schuster, Searcey, Thomas, Wehrbein. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.

Moved by Searcey and seconded by Thomas "to approve the ESU 4 Core Services Resolution as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Schuster, Searcey, Thomas, Wehrbein, Rule. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 5-0.
