The leaves are falling, and the weather is turning colder. Fall is here to stay and maybe a touch of winter is in the air.

Intro to Design students are using their knowledge of design principles and elements to design products in

the classroom. They completed a paper shoe using color schemes, examples of design principles using craft foam objects, tessellations, and a batik project.





PBL students have completed a variety of projects ranging

from preparing for a start-up business to making fantastic cookies. Students are continuing to complete projects through the end of the semester.

Eighth grade students moved into FACS the second quarter the middle of

October. They did a quick Digital Review followed by learning about a variety of Ag Careers. The highlight of that unit was an original pizza created and designed by individual groups.

The Backpack Connection Series was created by TACSEI to provide a way for teachers and parents/caregivers to work together to help young children develop social emotional skills and reduce challenging behavior. Teachers may choose to send a handout home in each child's backpack when a new strategy or skill is introduced to the class. Each Backpack Connection handout provides information that helps parents stay informed about what their child is learning at school and specific ideas on how to use the strategy or skill at home.

The Pyramid Model



The Pyramid Model is a framework that provides programs with guidance on how to promote social emotional compe-

tence in all children and design effective interventions that support young children who might have persistent challenging behavior. It also provides practices to ensure that children with social emotional delays receive intentional teaching. Programs that implement the Pyramid Model are eager to work together with families to meet every child's individualized learning and support needs. How to Help Your Child Transition Smoothly Between Places and Activities

Transitioning, or moving, to new places, people and activities is something we do many times during the day. However, change can be overwhelming and seem unpredictable for your child, especially when she is not ready to move on to the next place or activity. Children make many transitions each day from parents to teachers, from home to cat, or from play time to the dinner table, for example. When and how often transitions occur are usually decided by an adult and children often act out with challenging behavior when they feel unable to control their routine. When you help your child prepare for transitions you are helping her to learn a valuable skill. The good news is that you can teach her this important skill while you are enjoying time together.



😰 Try This at Home

- Use a timer, an instrument or a funny noise to give your child advance warning of routine transition events. If possible, ask him to help "alert" everyone to the upcoming event. For example, let your roddler bang a pot with a wooden spoon to let the family know it is time for dinnet.
- Let your child pick out a special object or toy to transition with to the next activity or place. "Would kitty like to come with us to the grocery store? I wonder if she could help us find the items on our list?"
- Use a visual schedule to show your child the plan for the day. "First, you have school and then we are going to take Aunt Rachel's gift to the post office and mail it to her."
- Make the transition a game or activity where the child has the opportunity to move around. "I wonder if today we can use this big shovel to scoop the cars into the bucket while we clean up?" If possible, let him think of the game. "I wonder how we could get to the car today?" You might be surprised at his creativity and how much fun you have roaring like a dinosaur or hopping like a tabbit.
- Sing songs as you transition. Children love to hear songs as they move about their day. Make up silly songs together about what you are doing or where you are going. You are sure to get a laugh and likely a smooth transition.
- Give your child a job, Children are more cooperative when they can be part of the process. Perhaps he can help stir something for dinner, unlock the car doors with the remote or pick out a diaper before a diaper change.

Practice at School

Children transition from one activity to the next throughout their day at preschool. Teachers plan for transitions in advance by creating special routines. These routines help to prepare children for transitions, engage them in the change that is taking place and help them to move smoothly to the next activity. Teachers might use a special instrument or song to let children know it is clean up time. Teachers might read books to the children while they are standing in line waiting for a turn to wash their hands before snack or create an obstacle course or morning routine to help children and parents transition at drop-off. When children are able to participate in or lead the transition, they are excited and eager to move to a new activity.

🚱 The Bottom Line

The more a child can predict and participate in the schedule and activities of her day, the less likely it is that challenging behavior will occur and the more likely it is that she will eagerly engage in transitions to new people and places. Taking the time and making the effort to teach her what to expect, when it will happen, and what happens before the transition occurs can be a rewarding experience. Most importantly, it is also an opportunity for quality time that can help lead to smoother transitions.

Lewiston Consolidated Schools School Board Meeting Minutes October 17, 2022

A regular meeting of the District 69 Board of Education, Pawnee County, was held on Monday, October 17 th, at 8:00 p.m., the meeting being open to the public and proceeded in notice as required by law. Notice of this meeting was given to the President and all members of the Board and a copy of the acknowledgement of notice and the agenda is noted in the minutes.

Availability of the agenda was communicated to the public in advanced notice and to the President of the Board and all Board members.

The meeting was called to order, the Open Meetings Law poster recognized, and verbal notice that the meeting was recorded was given by the President and on a roll call vote, the

following members were present: Bredemeier, Howell, Rule, Schuster, Searcey, and Wehrbein.

Excused Absence: none. Also present: Rick Kentfield, Juli Smith, and visitors.

The agenda was reviewed. Moved by Howell and seconded by Searcey "to approve the agenda as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Howell, Rule, Schuster, Searcey,

Wehrbein, and Bredemeier. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 6-0.

There were no visitor comments.

Moved by Wehrbein and seconded by Bredemeier "to approve 4.1 minutes of the consent agenda as presented withholding items 4.2 treasurer's report and 4.3 claims for further discussion." Those voting in favor of said motion: Rule, Schuster, Searcey, Wehrbein, Bredemeier, and Howell. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 6-0.

Moved by Bredemeier and seconded by Howell "to approve the treasurer's report and claims in the amount of \$129,369.00, payroll in the amount of \$267,620.00, and the transfer of \$20,000 from General Fund to the Activity Fund." Those voting in favor of said motion: Schuster, Searcey, Wehrbein, Bredemeier, Howell, and Rule. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 6-0.

Pandora Worthey and Allana Deane presented information regarding the district's MTSS process as it relates to early childhood programming. No action was taken.

Moved by Wehrbein and seconded by Bredemeier "to approve the sale of school property identified in the Memorandum of Contract to the Lewiston Family Housing, LLC, A Nebraska Liability Company as presented." Those voting in favor of said motion: Searcey, Wehrbein, Bredemeier, Howell, Rule, and Schuster. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 6-0.

Moved by Searcey and seconded by Howell "to appoint Rick Kentfield, Superintendent, to act on the district's behalf to finalize the Property Sale Contract and Warranty Deeds as presented. Those voting in favor of said motion: Wehrbein, Bredemeier, Howell, Rule, Schuster, and Searcey. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 6-0.

Rick Kentfield, Superintendent reported on the board of education's Americanism Committee's plan to host a Veteran's Day Program for students in grades PK-12, veterans, and community members from the surrounding area on Friday, November 11, 2022. The program will include a social at 9:30 am, a program at 10:00 am, and lunch to follow at the Virginia Legion in Virginia, NE. Members of the Lewiston National Honor Society will assist with the day's events. No action was taken.

Rick Kentfield, Superintendent reported on the progress at the new football field, school rental house, and the new AG building.

No action was taken.

Juli Smith, K-12 Principal, reported on various school activities.

Rick Kentfield, Superintendent, reported on SENCAP, the district's ESSER III expenditure plan, the 2022 State Education Conference, and the upcoming board vacancy.

Board Committee report – no report. The board's negotiation committee scheduled a meeting with the Lewiston Education Association's negotiation committee on Wednesday, November 16th, at 6:30 p.m.

Moved by Schuster and seconded by Searcey "to adjourn at 9:52 p.m." Those voting in

favor of said motion: Bredemeier, Howell, Rule, Schuster, Searcey, and Wehrbein. Those opposed: none. Motion carried, 6-0.

Next regular school board meeting will be Wednesday, November 16th, at 7:00 p.m.
